

WHEN RIGHT IS WRONG

Take the log out of your own eye. Win the battle, but lose the war. Cut off your nose to spite your face. Strain the gnat swallow the camel. Throw out the baby with the bath water. Do not kill the fly on your head with a hammer. Love covers a multitude of sins.

Many of us believe we have the God given insight of being right. Maybe we are even often right. Does that make us more Christlike? Does it help others around us become more Christlike?

It can, but does it? When I explain why I am right, when I undermine the wrong viewpoint, when I speak up and show people they are wrong, is the outcome growth in Christlikeness? For them or for me? I am not asking about the way things ought to be, but the way they actually are.

The idioms above have in common an outcome-based perspective. Thinking about the outcome impacts the way that you act now.

One of the key factors in representing the truth is to recognize that people are in a growth process. It is not helpful to reject someone, or make them feel as if they are not enough, just because they are still growing in a certain area. Graciousness demands that we are patient, kind, and long-suffering. Do those sound familiar? (Cf. Galatians 5:22-23).

Sometimes in relationships, even in our homes, people act badly. What is our desired outcome? 1) to prove that we are right or to hurt them back or 2) is it to see them overcome their sin? It can really get tricky here. Sometimes the first intent is covered by the garments of the second. Sometimes we even deceive ourselves.

Is there a time to confront? Certainly. Confrontation is also the time for kindness, gentleness and self-control. However, there is also a time for patience and long-suffering – a time not to confront. Christlikeness is not a buffet to choose certain parts of His character. So there may be a time to wait.

ANN MASON'S TIPS

EZ-PZ is what we all like to read when looking for a new recipe. This “cake” recipe is probably as EZ-PZ as you can get

One box of cake mix, any flavor
One box of Angel food cake mix

Mix the dry cake mixes together in a large bowl. Store in an airtight container. I actually used a freezer bag. When you want an easy dessert, measure 3 T of the cake mixture in a regular size mug, add 2 T water and stir. Microwave for 70 seconds. EZ-PZ for sure!! And super easy for your kids or grandkids to do themselves.

About ten years ago, the boring, colorless cauliflower became “trendy” — rice, pizza crust, even entire cookbooks filled with all things cauliflower. So now be on the lookout for the latest trend, the radish. A popular snack in France is butter spread thick between 2 halves of a fresh radish. Some cooks even suggest replacing potatoes with radishes. I just can't imagine serving mashed radishes for dinner. How about you?

In the late 1800's, there were many very small villages, too small to build a church and support a Pastor. An ingenious solution was found for the areas that were served by railroads. The Railroad Chapel Cars were coupled to passenger trains and parked on sidings. They would have Sunday School and church services as well as weddings and funerals. I don't know for sure but I would imagine after-church potlucks too. The chapel cars were large enough for about 80 people. By the 1890's, the Episcopal, Baptist and Catholic missionary societies all had chapel cars. Now that was an ingenious idea indeed.

This waiting, this delay is a time to give the Lord a chance to grow a person in preparation of where He will take them at a later time. This is a time to recognize that we are all works in progress. We need to learn to work effectively with people who are not yet complete in Christ (as we are not complete yet either).

This begs the question, 'How do I know when to be long-suffering and when to confront?'

First, consult the Holy Spirit. Pray. He will direct. I do not believe the Holy Spirit hides His will from those who genuinely seek it. However, our desire to see a person put in their place, and a host of other sinful desires, may get in the way of hearing how the Holy Spirit answers this question. Pray that His voice will be heard above our fleshly, sinful desires.

Second, be honest about what you really want. I am sometimes motivated by sinful desires. I sometimes cover the sinful motivation with one that appears more godly. E.g. I am just standing up for the truth, therefore I have to confront your wrongness. Again, ask the Holy Spirit to reveal your actual motivations. When those motivations are revealed to be sinful – repent, regroup and re-evaluate.

Third, let your desired outcome govern your actions. Let the desired outcome for their good inform your tone and communication. If you want the good outcome, make sure that your words and tone line up with that. Sometimes the devil will spoil our good intentions with a betraying tone and bad body language. Again, pray for help.

Fourth, be humble. This is meant to undergird the other three, but it can also be stated directly. I may face a situation where someone has offended me. I am also the cause of offense to someone who is being patient with me. We are all on a journey. We all need patience. Even when I need to confront, it is not because I am better than anyone. We are all on a journey. We are just struggling in different areas. We are not there yet – none of us. Be patient.

Be kind. Be long-suffering.
