

SHOULD CHANGE TAKE A LONG TIME?

"If God is involved, change should not take a long time." That statement resonates with me. However, it is not always true and it is not as simple as it seems.

I introduce this concept because of the recently recognized TBC Vision statement. This statement is a picture when what we, as a church, believe that we should become. It is an expression of the areas that the Lord would have us grow. It is a description of the changes that the Lord would have us to make. This included but was not limited to significant changes in worship, devotions, discipleship, Gospel proclamation. Leadership and prayer. As we codified this statement, we were having in mind change over the next 5-10 years.

Does God want us to change? Certainly He does. Maybe we do not like the word 'change'. We can use the word 'grow' if that is easier. But growth means change! But consider: If He is involved and it is His will, is it reasonable to expect that it should take ten years to get there? I think that we should consider a couple of examples from Scripture to help us answer that question.

Jesus went out of His way to help the disciples understand that the Gospel that He was bringing applied equally to the Gentiles as well as the Jews. Several of the most compelling stories about Jesus center around His ministry with Gentiles (e.g. the Samaritan woman; the demoniac; Jairus' son; the Syro-Phoenician woman, the feeding the four thousand; etc.). Jesus taught the disciples the expansive extent of the Gospel throughout His earthly ministry. Yet, it is a fair assessment that they did not get it until at least Acts 15, at the Jerusalem council, decades after Jesus started dealing with this problem. Jesus was the perfect teacher, yet the problem took decades to solve, and maybe longer.

Consider another example: From the scene with golden calf onward, the Jewish people had a huge problem with idol worship. God sent priests and prophets to help people overcome idolatry. He worked through geopolitical forces to teach Israel that He alone was God. Over hundreds of years, God worked on this problem, finally solving it through the seventy-year captivity. While the Jews were far from perfect after the captivity, idol worship was never again the national sin it used to be.

Some challenges/problems are so big that it may take years or decades to solve them. If you can, take a step away from your current situation and look with a bird's eye view of your life. I suspect



WATER DAMAGE UPDATE

On January 16, 2024, our pipes in the church froze and broke. By the time we discovered the break, there was about 16 inches of water in the furnace room behind the Fireside room. Water had leaked from there all the way to the bathrooms on the far side of the basement. Although most of the basement had less than 3 inches of water, it was enough water to get to almost all the drywall in the basement and to all of the flooring in the basement. Drywall wicks up water, so all of the almost all drywall is damaged. Water got under the flooring and under the asbestos tiling underneath.

The following work will need to be done (or is being done):

- 1) Water removed from basement (complete)
- 2) Broken water pipes repaired (complete)
- 3) Elevator needs to be inspected (complete)
- 4) Damaged items need to be catalogued and removed (**complete**)
- 5) Secure approval from insurance for repairs (ongoing, but favorable so far)
- 6) All items need to be removed from basement And stored during repairs (complete)
- 7) Basement needs to be dried (complete)
- 8) Asbestos abatement needs to be done to remove flooring and 2 feet of drywall (complete)
- 9) Replacement of numerous items (about to be scheduled)
 - a. New flooring installed
 - b. New drywall installed
 - c. Painting
 - d. Stored items returned

Best case scenario is that the basement will be available by mid-April.

It appears that the insurance will cover most of the expenses which will be well into six figures. Our out-of-pocket anticipated liability should be about \$5k which includes our deductible and the plumbing bill.

With the asbestos abatement complete, the basement is semi-usable until the repair work starts (which will be 3-4 weeks). Sunday School and Ladies Bible Study will be in the basement until the work starts.
