THE POWER OF STORY

Matthew 13:34 All these things Jesus spoke to the multitude in parables; and without a parable He did not speak to them.

"Always tell the truth because if you don't, people will not believe you when it is really important." I think that most of us know this lesson. I expect that we have all meticulously been taught it, but not in that form. Rather, we were taught about The Boy who Cried Wolf. To tell that story takes about two to five minutes, yet the point is solely what this paragraph opened with. Would it not be easier to just state the point?

Why do we teach our children through stories? Surely it would be faster to just get to the point. However, it would be far less effective. We teach in stories because we want to inculcate beliefs or values. Straightforward point-based teaching is often the least effective means to influence values and beliefs. There is a large part of me that wants to reject this truism. Personally, I have tried to allow logic and straightforward argument to govern my values and beliefs. For many years, I have used logical argumentation as my primary means of influence. However, for most people today, this thinking dramatically limited my influence.

Most values are obtained and formed through not just the intellect, but also the emotions and the imagination. The story of the boy who cried wolf informs at all three levels. My initial statement only informs the intellect. It is therefore a less effective tool for influencing values. Many people know this intuitively, and Jesus certainly did. Jesus was continually telling stories, illustrations or parables.

We have just finished the Christmas season, and we find that more people come to church this time of year than any other. The second most common time for church attendance is around Resurrection Sunday. Have you ever wondered why? In part, it is because these are the seasons of our best stories. The birth of Jesus and His death and resurrection are evocative stories. I am not saying that everyone who comes to church understands, but there is something about the stories that draws them.

Stories are powerful in society. I could mention the Tortoise and the Hare; the Ant and the Grasshopper; Androcles (the

Tell them to your kids and grandkids. Tell the stories that display the goodness, the grandeur, the love, the compassion of God in your stories. Glorify God by telling God's story in your life.
