ARE THE BEST CHRISTIANS MINISTERS?

Are the Best Christians Pastors and Missionaries? My title is meant to just be a teaser, so let me say immediately that the answer is a categorical 'No'. However, let me explain why I ask the question.

For some time, I have been exposed in various ways to a concept called 'Business as mission' (BAM) or 'Profession as mission'. This is an idea in global missions where we send business people to serve as missionaries, rather than traditional full-time church planters. They would be in the country serving in business or teaching in a secular school. They would build relationships with non-Christians in that context and then share the gospel and make disciples. This is being implemented in many countries that are closed to traditional missionaries. Some of our Global partners are partially doing this very ministry including the Hermans.

Some of the potential benefits include:

- Closed locations may be open
- It provides a reason to be there
- It allows the global partner to demonstrate Christ-transformed living in an everyday context
- It provides a network of relationships which are not cold-contact or contrived
- It can be partially or fully self-funded
- It provides a valuable service or jobs for the indigenous community

There are some drawbacks as well, but it is not my intention in this article to develop or promote this concept, but to launch some thoughts from it. If you want more information, you could try:

2023 Goals

Each year, we do a ministry report for WorldVenture that helps us set goals for the coming year. Please **pray** for us for our 2023 ministry goals. Jodi will finish her two semesters of internship for her Masters in Clinical Mental Health Counseling, take several tests then graduate in August 2023. This education has opened opportunities for her to minister to our team and contacts in Indonesia. When she graduates she would like to also contract with The Well International, a Christian, donor-funded organization based in Thailand in order to serve cross-cultural workers in Asia and around the world.

Return to Kendari

Pray we may return to Kendari in May and in October, for 5-6 weeks each time. We plan to visit and encourage several of our new WorldVenture teammates, extend the All Asia Gathering in Indonesia, mobilize new workers at Indonesian seminaries and missionary sending organizations, do training, encourage and mentor our Indonesian leaders and team, evaluate ministry, implement necessary changes, and promote the accesses. **Please pray God will provide the additional \$6,000 needed for airfare for these two trips.**

Work in the United States

While basing in the U.S. this year, we will continue to remain fully engaged with our team via video calls, texting, and social media. This has been a good way to keep connected to the ministry, and be able to continue to encourage, challenge, mentor and advise our team. We **praise** God for the great growth we have seen in each member, as they really have stepped up into various ministry and leadership roles. **Pray** that two study groups will become house churches.

Access and Unreached People Groups

We will continue to build the accesses—KLC English and Cups Café—so they become self-sustaining. We **praise** God for growth in 2022. **Pray** we find creative ways to promote and serve our students and customers.

Pray we will continue to mobilize new workers for the Muna team. **Pray** we can more deeply engage the 10 unreached people groups we are targeting by helping establish teams who will live among and serve each of these groups.
