JESUS SEES WOMEN

John 4:12 "Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank from it himself, as well as his sons and his livestock?" NKJV

What does the tragic rape of Dinah and the story of the woman at the well have in common? They both happened in the same place. Shechem and Sychar are different names for the same place.

The story of Dinah in Genesis 34 is about God's leading of Jacob and his family. It highlights the failures of the people of God. Chief among these failures is the callous disregard for the plight of many women. You should read the story again, taking note of the horrible circumstances for Dinah. I will summarize: Dinah is the only sister of the twelve sons of Jacob. She is raped by a man named Shechem. No one cares about Dinah. No one sees her pain and suffering. Except to use it as political capital, her father, Jacob, ignores the crime. Two of her brothers take vengeance. However, it was based on the fact that their property was damaged. No one saw Dinah at Shechem/ Sychar.


In John 4, we jump ahead, some 1500 years, to meet the unnamed woman at the well. Have you previously realized that you did not even know her name? She too is a woman who has been treated as property. We have always assumed that she was an immoral woman. That is what we learned in church. It is what I have taught or at least suggested. I do not believe that this is the case anymore. She had five husbands. In that culture, women did not have the right to divorce. Only men did. Women also had very little opportunity to earn enough money to take care of themselves without a man. She either had the tragedy of losing her husbands to death, or they simply chose to discard her. The man that she was then with was not her husband. It could be that they were together without being married, but it could also be that a brother of one of her husbands took her in out of a social obligation and used her as a servant or concubine without marriage. We just do not know. Usually, people do not care. People do not even see her. She asks of Jesus a fascinating

WATER DAMAGE UPDATE

On January 16, 2024, our pipes in the church froze and broke. There has been much repair done, now we need to replace much drywall and flooring. The process of working with busy contractors and insurance people has been slow. We are confident that most of the expenses will be covered. We should be able to schedule the final repairs in the next few days. This has been a really slow process.

The following work will need to be done (or is being done):

- 1) Water removed from basement (complete)
- 2) Broken water pipes repaired (complete)
- 3) Elevator needs to be inspected (complete)
- 4) Damaged items need to be catalogued and removed (complete)
- 5) Secure approval from insurance for repairs (ongoing, but favorable so far)
- 6) All items need to be removed from basement and stored during repairs (complete)
- 7) Basement needs to be dried (complete)
- 8) Asbestos abatement needs to be done to remove flooring and 2 feet of drywall (complete)
- 9) Replacement of numerous items (This is now scheduled. We hope work will be completed by the end of June)
 - a New flooring installed
 - b New drywall installed
 - c Painting
 - d Stored items returned

Insurance has agreed to pay for all of the work. We are responsible for the deductible (\$2,500) and the plumbing repairs (less than \$5,000).

Faith Story

Radha was born and raised in the city of Phnom Penh, Cambodia, of Indian descent. Both of his parents were devout Hindus. Radha became a Christian in 1973 through an English class that his church provided free of charge. It was a hard decision to make because of his Hindu family, and he was their eldest child. He accepted the Lord, however, because he was sure Jesus was the only one who could save him from his sin. Samen was also born in the city of Phnom Penh and is in the third generation of Christian believers in her family. Her father was a Cambodian Christian pastor.

Radha married Samen in 1978, and they have five children.

Ministry Focus

After Radha's first trip back to Cambodia in 1989, God put a burden in his heart to help rebuild Cambodian churches. To do this, Radha needed to step out of his role as a pastor of a local church and begin the challenge of working with many Cambodian churches.

He sees church planting and leadership development as critical to the growth of the Cambodian church. The Khmer church needs someone who can train Cambodian church planters, send them out, and produce the materials they need in order to do their job. The goal is to develop leadership and resources for the churches in Cambodia.

In 1993, Radha and Samen were appointed by Missions Door to work with Cambodian churches in North America and in Cambodia. In 2004 Missions Door named Radha the Cambodian Ministry Specialist and Coordinator.
